Dear Parents/Carers,

At the Subject Evening, you will have discussed your child's Science GCSE Course Options with their teacher. The Science Department is offering three courses. Each of these courses is outlined below and the course your child has been allocated to has been indicated. Should you have any concerns or gueries then please do not hesitate to contact me.

At Wood Green we deliver the OCR Twenty First Century Science Syllabus. Each of the three GCSE options has a different focus, depending on the students' anticipated needs. Details of the three options are below:

We currently have your child in a class to study Option 1: Core and Additional Applied GCSE. This course is appropriate for students who find science more relevant in work related contexts. There is a strong focus on applications in everyday life, at home and in different occupations. Students look at science in the life care, materials and manufacturing and consumer protection industries.

The Core GCSE will require students to sit 3 exams and carry out the same coursework as those sitting Option 2. The Additional Applied Qualification will involve 60% coursework plus 2 exams in the summer of Year 11.

The Core and Additional Applied GCSE option is suitable for students who definitely know they do not wish to do science after GCSE, as it is not sufficient preparation for AS study in **Science.** Wood Green School, in line with other local schools, will not accept students onto AS level Science courses with less than a B grade in the Core and Additional option. Students who study the Core and Additional Applied option cannot do AS level Science. The course is suitable preparation for college courses and would not stop students from studying other AS subjects at Wood Green.
