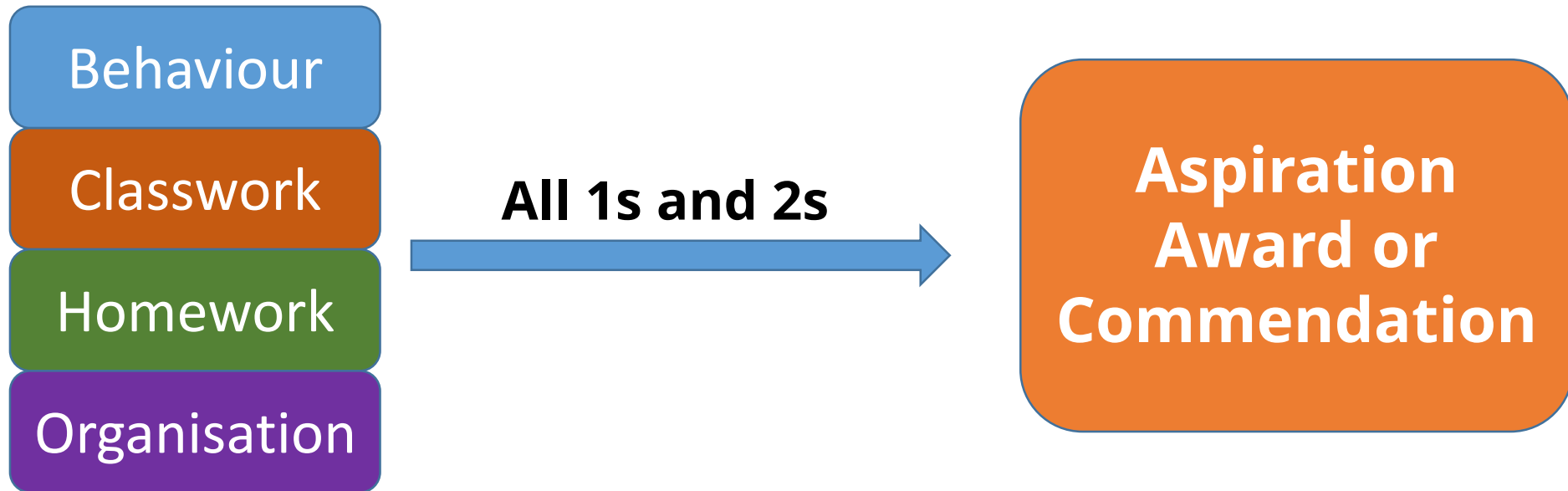

# Attitudes to Learning

The Baccalaureate starts with putting your best into your learning. Each term, teachers give you a grade for each of our four Attitudes to Learning from Grade 1 (excellent) to 4 (serious concerns). Students who receive at least all 2s (all good) will receive an Aspiration Commendation and have their name read out in our termly Celebration Assembly. Students who receive approximately 10 1s (depending on the number of options you choose) as well will receive an Aspiration Award and collect a certificate at the assembly.

# KS4 Baccalaureate criteria

1. Aspiration Awards from Celebration Assemblies
    - 3 out of the 4 possible (Xmas, Easter & Summer Yr10 and Xmas Yr 11)
  2. Attendance
    - Cumulative 95% at December 1<sup>st</sup> of Yr11 (special consideration is given)
  3. House Points
    - Bronze Award (50 points) or Grand Slam (5 house points in each of the 6 categories)
  4. Learning
    - Maintaining or improving review expected grades from Summer Yr10 to Nov Yr11
    - Completing Work Experience
    - Completing Personal Development Programme
  5. Nurture
    - At least 10 hours contributing to wider school life (being nice!)
  6. WELLBeing
    - At least 15 hours regular physical activity
  7. Skill
    - At least 15 hours commitment to developing an existing or new skill
