



Remote learning guidance for WGS

This guidance takes effect from the 25th of April 2022 and is in line with government guidance issued on the 30th of March 2022. As students no longer need to routinely test for Covid, we would normally expect students to stay at home if they are ill and return when they are well enough to attend, as they would with any normal illness. This means we will no longer provide remote learning for students who are off ill.

Attendance is mandatory for all students of compulsory school age. Wood Green School will consider providing remote education to students in circumstances when in-person attendance is either not possible or contrary to government guidance.

Wood Green School will consider providing remote learning in the following circumstances:

- occasions when school leaders decide that it is not possible for their setting to open safely, or that opening would contradict guidance from local or central government
- occasions when individual students, for a limited duration, are unable to physically attend their school but are able to continue learning: we would normally expect this enforced absence to have been agreed by a doctor or other health professional

Due to the disrupted nature of their education over the last two years, we will provide remote learning for year 11 students who are absent due to illness until Friday May the 13th 2022 and for year 13 students until Friday May the 20th 2022. Students should contact their teacher directly and ask to be allowed to attend the lesson remotely. This is only for short term absence caused by illness in the run up to exams and is not an alternative to attending lessons for the last few weeks of their education.
